





MATERIALS LIST

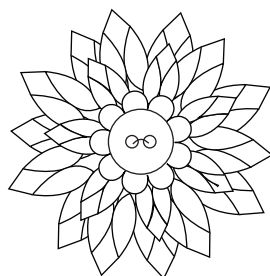
- diecut pattern (purchased from carinagardner.com or silhouetteamerica.com)
- button or embellishment
- fabric

SUPPLY LIST

- diecutting machine
- hot glue gun and sticks
- thread (if sewing button)
- scissors
- hand sewing needle (if sewing button)

-  fabric wrong-side

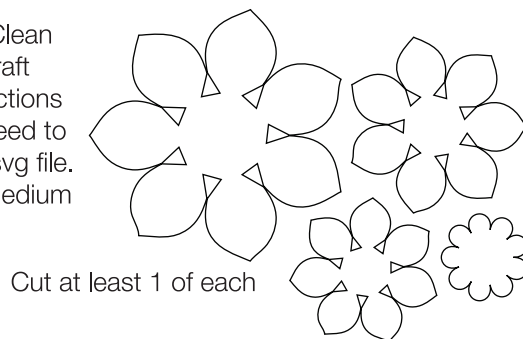


DAISY DARLING FABRIC FLOWER DIECUT PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS

1. Cut Out Your Diecut

Cut out the diecut with your machine using the Clean Cut Fabric Interfacing (purchased at your local craft shop or at silhouetteamerica.com.) Use the instructions on the package to prepare for cutting. You will need to cut out at least 1 of each piece provided in the svg file. For a fuller flower, cut an extra piece large and medium piece.



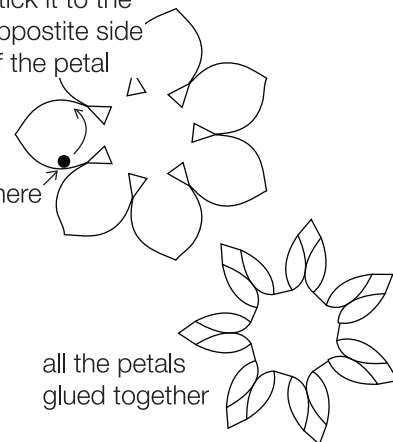
Cut at least 1 of each

2. Hot Glue the Petals

Carefully dab a small amount of glue to the middle side of a petal and glue the opposite side of the petal together (as shown in illustration). Repeat with all the petals on all the flower pieces.

Stick it to the opposite side of the petal

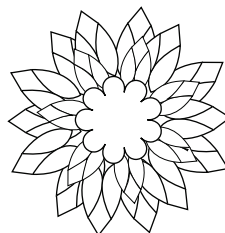

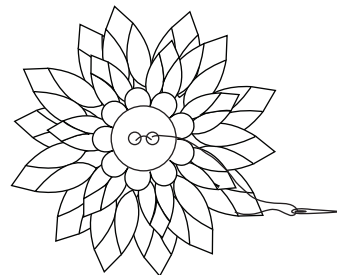
3. Hot Glue the Flower Pieces Together

Dab a small amount of hot glue to the center of each of the pieces. Rotate the flowers so that the petals intersect with each other.



3. Embellish

Embellish with a button in the center of the flower or add a kabob stick as a stem. Sew or hot glue on the button. Use the flower for barrettes, home decor, pins, or other great sewing projects!



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
