

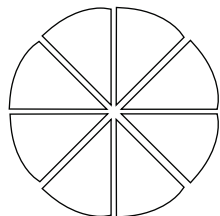

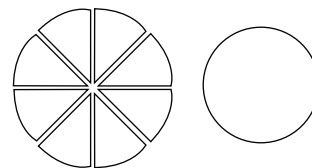


## EVERYDAY PINCUSHION DIECUT PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS

### 1. Cut Out Your Diecut

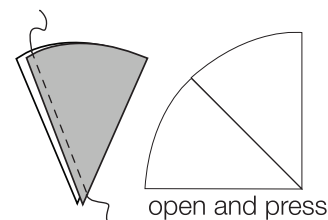
Cut out the diecut with your machine using the Sewable Fabric Interfacing (purchased at your local craft shop or at silhouetteamerica.com). Use the instructions on the package to prepare for cutting. You will need to cut out 8 pie pieces and 1 circle (all from different fabric is desired).

### 2. Sew Together the Top of the Pincushion

a. With right-sides together, sew together two of the pie shaped pieces. Open and press the seam to the right. Repeat with the other pie pieces until you have 4 sets of two.

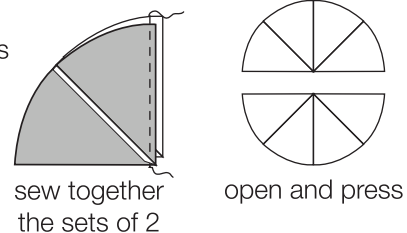

4 sets of 2

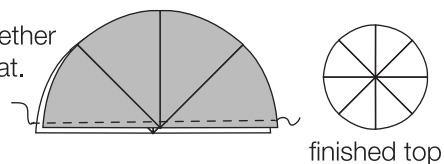
b. Then, with right-sides together sew two of the sets together. Repeat with the other two sets.

open and press

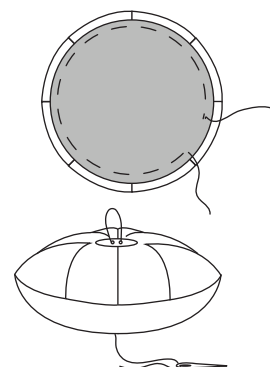
c. Finish the top of the pincushion by sewing together one of the sets of 4 to the other set of 4. Press flat.

### 3. Finish the Pincushion

Place right-sides together of the pieced top of the pincushion and the circle. Sew along the edge leaving a small gap (about 1 inch) open. Turn the pincushion right-side out and fill with stuffing. Hand-stitch the pin cushion closed once filled.



### 4. Add a Button

Sew a button into the top of the pincushion and have the stitches go all the way through to the bottom of the pincushion. Sew the stitches tight to achieve an indentation with the button.
